### **EDUCATION COMMITTEE**

#### INTRODUCTION

The Education Committee is a sub-committee of the Pharmacy Council established under the provisions of Section II of the First Schedule of the Pharmacy Act 1966.

### **ROLE OF THE COMMITTEE**

- To develop and monitor policies that guide Council's Education programme
- To liaise with institutions approved for training of pharmacy professionals
- ❖ To provide general oversight of the Foreign Trained Pharmacist Qualifying Examinations (FTPQE)
- ❖ To provide general oversight of the Pharmacy Internship programme

### **COMPOSITION**

The committee is constituted as follows:

- Chairman of Council board (ex-officio)
- Committee Chair- Council Member
- Two (2) Members of Council board
- Three (3) Co-opted Members
- Registrar of Council
- All Pharmacy Inspectors

## **QUORUM**

The quorum of the Education Committee shall be fifty-percent (50%) of the membership plus one.

- cs Reviewing applications for re-instatement on the Register of pharmacists
- Reviewing requests for accreditation of Continuing Education (CE) seminars

- ☑ Developing the Public Awareness Programme
- ☑ Reviewing operations of the Pharmacy Internship Programme
- S Fostering collaboration with Pharmacy Training institutions.
